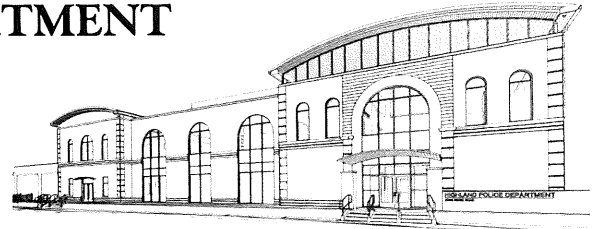

Chief Hojnicky also noted the recent passing of former Commander George Georgeff's father.

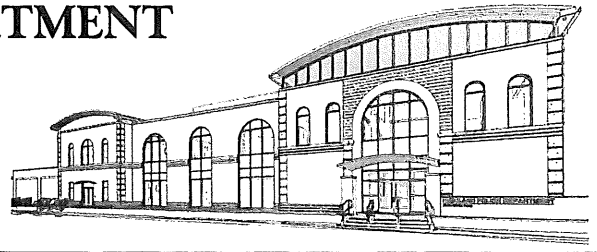
With no further business the meeting adjourned at 7:14 PM as recorded by Recording Secretary LuAnn Stirling.
